TONE 6 31st Sunday after Pentecost/Sunday after the Nativity of Christ Holy Righteous Ones: Joseph the Betrothed, David the King, and James the Brother of the Lord/Afterfeast of the Nativity of Christ Sunday before the Theophany

Tone 6 Troparion (*Resurrection*) // The Angelic <u>Pow</u>ers were at Thy tomb; / the guards became as <u>dead</u> men. / Mary <u>stood</u> by Thy grave, / seeking Thy most pure <u>body</u>. / Thou didst capture hell not being <u>tempt</u>ed by it. / Thou didst come to the Virgin, <u>granting</u> life.// O Lord, Who didst rise from the dead, <u>glo</u>ry to Thee.

Tone 4 Troparion *(for the Feast) //* Thy Nativity, O <u>Christ</u> our God, / has shone to the world the light of <u>wis</u>dom! / For by it, those who <u>wor</u>shipped the stars, / were taught by a star to a<u>dore</u> Thee, / the Sun of <u>right</u>eousness, / and to know Thee, the <u>Or</u>ient from on high.// O Lord, <u>glory</u> to Thee!

Tone 2 Troparion (of the Righteous Ones) // Pro<u>claim</u> the wonder, O Joseph,/ to David, the <u>ancestor</u> of God; / thou hast <u>seen</u> a Virgin <u>great</u> with child; / and thou didst give glory with the <u>shep</u>herds; /thou didst worship with the <u>Magi</u>,/ and didst receive the news from the <u>Angel</u>. // Pray to <u>Christ</u> God to <u>save</u> our souls!

Tone 3 Kontakion (of the Righteous Ones) // Today godly <u>Da</u>vid is <u>filled</u> with joy; / Joseph and James <u>off</u>er praise. / The glorious <u>crown</u> of their kinship with Christ fills them with <u>great</u> joy. / They sing praises to the One ineffably <u>born</u> on earth, // and they cry out: "O Compassionate One, <u>save</u> those who <u>hon</u>or Thee!"

Tone 3 Kontakion of the Feast Today the Virgin gives birth to the Transcendent One, / and the earth offers a cave to the Unap<u>proach</u>able One. / <u>Ang</u>els with shepherds <u>glo</u>rify Him; / the Wise Men <u>jour</u>ney with the star,// since for our sake the eternal <u>God</u> was <u>born</u> as a <u>lit</u>tle Child!

Matthew 2:13-23 (Gospel)

Now when they had departed, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream, saying, "Arise, take the young Child and His mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I bring you word; for Herod will seek the young Child to destroy Him." When he arose, he took the young Child and His mother by night and departed for Egypt, and was there until the death of Herod, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the Lord through the prophet, saying, "Out of Egypt I called My Son." Then Herod, when he saw that he was deceived by the wise men, was exceedingly angry; and he sent forth and put to death all the male children who were in Bethlehem and in all its districts, from two years old and under, according to the time which he had determined from the wise men. Then was fulfilled what was spoken by Jeremiah the prophet, saying: "A voice was heard in Ramah, lamentation, weeping, and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children, refusing to be comforted, because they are no more." Now when Herod was dead, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt, saying, "Arise, take the young Child and His mother, and go to the land of Israel, for those who sought the young Child's life are dead." Then he arose, took the young Child and His mother, and came into the land of Israel. But when he heard that Archelaus was reigning over Judea instead of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there. And being warned by God in a dream, he turned aside into the region of Galilee. And he came and dwelt in a city called Nazareth, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophets, "He shall be called a Nazarene "

Royal Hours

Each Sunday before the Divine Liturgy, we celebrate 3rd and 6th Hours. These are very simple services where the reader reads a few psalms and we say some prayers to celebrate the morning hours and remember God's providence in our lives. On Friday, January 4th at 8:30am we will celebrate a grander version of 1st, 3rd, 6th, and 9th Hours known as Royal Hours which prepare us to celebrate the feast of the Lord's Theophany. Though similar to the services we have before Liturgy on Sundays, these hours include more prayers and songs, as well as Gospel readings. They are an excellent way to meditate on what the Lord has done for us.

Blessing of Hesperia Lake

When Our Lord was baptized in the Jordan, he blessed and sanctified all of creation and revealed Himself as God to the entire world. In remembrance of this, our parish will bless the waters of Hesperia Lake immediately following Liturgy next Sunday. There will be no coffee hour. The lake is only about 5 minutes down the road from our church. Everyone is highly encouraged to make an effort to attend this service. Not only is a wonderful way to celebrate Theophany, it is also a way to for us to witness to our community and proclaim the Good News that Christ has come to save everyone and every thing.
