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SUNDAY, MARCH 10 TONE 8 Sunday of Cheesefare: The Expulsion of Adam from Paradise

Tone 8 Troparion (Resurrection)

Thou didst des<u>cend</u> from on <u>high</u>, O <u>Mer</u>ciful One! / Thou didst ac<u>cept</u> the <u>three</u> day <u>bur</u>ial / to free us <u>from our suff</u>erings!// O Lord, our Life and Resurrection, glory to Thee!

Tone 8 Kontakion (Resurrection)

By rising <u>from</u> the <u>tomb</u>, Thou didst raise the dead and resurrected <u>Ad</u>am./ Eve exults <u>in</u> Thy <u>Resurrection</u>, // and the world <u>cel</u>ebrates Thy <u>rising</u> from the dead, O greatly <u>Mer</u>ciful One!

Tone 6 Kontakion (from the Lenten Triodion)

O Master, Teacher of <u>wis</u>dom, / Bestower of <u>vir</u>tue, / Who teachest the thoughtless and pro<u>tect</u>est the poor, / strengthen and en<u>light</u>en my heart! / O Word of the <u>Fa</u>ther, / let me not restrain my mouth from <u>cry</u>ing to Thee: / Have mercy on me, a trans<u>gres</u>sor,// O merciful Lord!

Matthew 6:14-21 (Gospel)

For if you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses. Moreover, when you fast, do not be like the hypocrites, with a sad countenance. For they disfigure their faces that they may appear to men to be fasting. Assuredly, I say to you, they have their reward. But you, when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, so that you do not appear to men to be fasting, but to your Father who is in the secret place; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you openly. Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal; but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

Forgiveness Sunday - Cheesefare

On this last Sunday before <u>Great Lent</u>, the last day that traditionally Orthodox Christians eat dairy products until Pascha, the Church remembers the expulsion of <u>Adam and Eve</u> from Paradise. <u>God</u> commanded them to <u>fast</u> from the fruit of a tree (Gen. 2:16), but they did not obey. In this way Adam and Eve and their descendants became heirs of death and corruption. We hear the Lord's teaching about fasting and forgiveness and enter the season of the fast forgiving one another so that God might forgive us. *If you forgive men their trespasses*, your heavenly Father will forgive you; but if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your heavenly Father forgive you your trespasses.

The Gospel reading also gives advice on fasting. Moreover, when you fast, do not be like the hypocrites, with a sad countenance. For they disfigure their faces that they may appear to men to be fasting. Assuredly, I say to you, they have their reward. But you, when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, so that you do not appear to men to be fasting, but to your Father who is in the secret place; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you openly.

The Rite of Forgiveness

After the dismissal at Vespers, the priest stands beside the <u>analogion</u>, or before the <u>ambon</u>, and the faithful come up one by one and <u>venerate</u> the <u>icon</u>, after which each makes a <u>prostration</u> or bow before the priest, saying, "Forgive me, a sinner." The priest also makes a prostration before each, saying, "God forgives. Forgive me." The person responds, "God forgives," and receives a blessing from the priest. Meanwhile the choir sings quietly the <u>irmoi</u> of the Paschal Canon, or else the Paschal Stichera. After receiving the priest's blessing, the faithful also ask forgiveness of each other.

Let us begin the <u>fast</u> with joy! Let us prepare ourselves for spiritual <u>eff</u>orts! Let us <u>cleanse</u> our soul and <u>cleanse</u> our flesh! Let us abstain from every passion as we ab<u>stain</u> from food!

Let us rejoice in virtues of the Spirit and ful<u>fill</u> them in love,

That we all may <u>see</u> the Passion of <u>Christ</u> our God,// and rejoice in spirit at the holy <u>Pascha!</u> - <u>Lenten Triodion</u>
